# SHELTIE CRAFTS

Shelties can be found in practically any craft form. Here are just a few examples of interesting hobbies available

### SPINNING "SHELTIE" DOGS HAIR

In 1980 I spent a holiday on the Isle of Arran and whilst there I encountered a lady who was giving spinning lessons with sheep fleeces. I duly took advantage of having a lesson whilst I was there.

At that time I already had a fair amount of dog hair and couldn't find anyone to spin it for me so I thought I would have a go myself.

I purchased a spinning wheel and fortunately I found a lady who gave lessons in spinning locally, although she only used fleece, but I started off by using the sheltie hair and found that I thoroughly enjoyed it once I could get the wheel to keep going in the right direction.

From thereon I continued to spin for a hobby and at Crufts dog show where I was exhibiting for the first time, I wore a jacket spun and knitted from my dog's hair. At that time there was a gentleman taking a film of different things and he filmed me in my outfit and I later discovered it was for Australian T.V. That was fortunate for my brother and his family who saw this before I did but wasn't too sure it was me.

Since then I have appeared on TV on four different occasions, sometimes at home and sometimes in the studio. Each occasion was an experience and the dogs I took along with me thoroughly enjoyed themselves.

At this time I was knitting up mittens, hats, waistcoats, jackets etc. but my final piece was a 'bedspread' of crocheted squares sewn together. It is a lovely piece of work and something I shall always cherish.

When 'Discover Dogs' was showcased at Earls Court, London, I was asked to come along with my spinning wheel to sit and spin and talk to the public. Over the following years I found that the spinning of dog hair was a great surprise to a lot of people who attended and they were all very interested in it.

I also spun at Crufts dog show for a number of years.

Shelties come in three colours - sable, blue merle and tricolour - so there is no need to dye the end product. Sables, of course, come in varying shades so there is more scope to use this colour. Blue merles are more difficult because of the black marbling in them, or black patches. The black pieces are usually of a greasy texture and no good for spinning. A good blue looks really attractive whereas those with a greyish look come up dirty looking. As regards to the tricolour, one needs a really dense black coat to produce a good black wool or else it comes up looking like a dirty dark blue merle.

I must say that since spinning the sheltie hair I have learned a lot about texture of the coats of the three different colours.

In order to obtain the correct ply for knitting one has to spin up two bobbins of wool and then ply these together. This will then knit up as a double knit.

If one wants to crochet then you only need a single ply

I would like to add, at this stage, that I never add any other textures to the spinning so the end product is purely sheltie hair.

Anyone who takes up spinning needs to have patience at the beginning but it will become a most interesting, worthwhile and satisfying occupation – particularly in the long winter evenings.

# 'Needlepoint' and 'Cross Stitch'

# **HERDING WITH SHELTIES**

# **IN POLAND**



Sheltie herding in Poland began in 2004 when the first Herding Instinct Test (HIT) was organized in a small town of Chybie. There were two shelties on the list and both of them passed the test. One year later the number of shelties that took the HIT increased to 13.

The first herding training started but there was no precise method; the shepherds worked intuitively based on the experience of herding with border collies. However, shelties work in a totally different way and so they need a different training system.

First of all, the training session should be short because the work makes them tired very quickly. Moreover, it is acceptable for shelties to bark at a sheep or to nip a lazy one. Shelties do not work with an intense eye like border collies do. Instead they show the loose- or medium-eyed working style, which means they do not concentrate solely on the flock but watch what is happening around it — it may seem to an average watcher they are not interested in the livestock. Fetching a flock, they do not always walk exactly behind it, sometimes they move along its sides.

Shelties are much more sensitive than border collies. That is why, during training the shepherd should pay special attention to stubborn sheep which may attack the sheepdog as after such an attack the dog may not be willing to work anymore.

Whether the training is successful depends on the shepherd's ability to show his approval or disapproval of the dog's work — changing the pitch of his voice and praising or correcting dog's behaviour at the right time pays a crucial role.

At the beginning the shepherd should teach a dog to stay calm in the presence of sheep because only calmness will enable the dog to guide the flock for a longer time. The dog should know that we support him constantly and are able to help him at any time – if we notice a stubborn sheep, we should help our dog either by changing the direction of walk or taking the sheep aside.





For the time being there are two shelties in Poland which have passed the HWT (Herding Working Test) test. One of them, DIAMOND BOY Moda na Sukces already participates in the trial competitions of the class 2 and the other one, PENELOPA z Puli Szczescia takes part in the trail competitions of the class 1. Both of them work with sheep everyday and have passed the HCT (Herding Capability Test) test and the JHD (Junior Herding Test) test of the American organization AHBA (American Herding Board Association) which unfortunately is not accepted by FCI (Federation Cynologue International).

There is also one more working sheltie in Poland, ALOA BEAUTY Ga-Nu-Ti, which regularly herds a flock of 2000 geese but recently she has started working with sheep.

I do hope that the number of Polish Shetland Sheepdogs that take part in herding trials grow gradually.

In UK, Rally O was initiated, and is governed by A.P.D.T (Association of Pet Dog Trainers),


### What is Rally?

Dog and handler team navigate a course with numbered signs indicating different exercises to perform such as, Sit Down, Sit, Straight, figure 8, Send over Jump, Recall over Jump, Left Turn. Teams navigate the course at a brisk continuous performance without direction from the judge. Handlers are encouraged to talk to their dogs during the performance.

All dogs, purebred, mixed breed and dogs with disabilities are encouraged to participate.

The aim of the UK APDT is to encourage all dog owners to take part in this new sport with a view to registering and competing for Rally titles and awards.



# **KEEPING THE DOG CLUBS ALIVE**

The art and the science of dog breeding has always been a delicate and sensitive endeavour. Breeds are constantly in danger from economic conditions, political upheavals, communicable diseases, governmental regulation, social mores, and genetic pitfalls. These conditions are perennially active or lurking, but today the situation of the breeders has changed markedly. Breeders are now in close and immediate contact locally and globally thanks to the internet. As a consequence, they are better informed, better organized, and able to face issues ranging from what food to buy. As a result, they present a more cohesive and effective front than at any time in the past.

Today when you open an internet list, a seminar is before you. Problems have little to no chance of being swept under the rug. Indeed, they are often nearly beaten to death. For the most part, the members of the dog community eagerly seek knowledge, offer challenging and provoking questions, and are solution oriented. There is a greater willingness to share information, and the computer provides the tools to make the sharing and documenting of information accessible and productive. Today's list "experts" seem not overly concerned with their prestige, and appear to be sincerely concerned with passing on information and philosophy.

The downside of the new cyberspace forum is that youngsters tend to bypass the clubs and formal organizations because of their rules, protocol, and stuffiness and join the more open society on the net. But, these formal organizations are essential to the future of the fancy. If clubs are to regain their vitality, I think they will have to find a way to become more encompassing and more accessible.

# **ALL FIRED UP**

## **Focusing Your Club's Energies**

You've all been there – started or joined a dog club to share interests with like minded people, to accomplish things. But somewhere along the line, the enthusiasm wanes, nothing happens within the group and everyone starts grumbling, nit-picking, dropping out. Your club, for which you had such high hopes, is floundering. As a member, or an executive officer you want to do something, but what? What are the secrets to reorganizing, revitalizing and nurturing a local breed club?

Let me share the experience of one all-breed club. It is a long established organization, with a large and multi-talented membership yet they were stuck in a rut. They held shows and did some public education, but like every club, all the work fell on the shoulders of a few core

members. Those few members were tired and no one else seemed willing to do anything, no one liked anyone's suggestions – like many clubs, they were struggling.

If they were going to turn things around and foster a more positive attitude, they had their work cut out for themselves. What the club was lacking was a focus, so the first order of business was to set up a planning day for the club executive.

Two experienced facilitators who were not involved in the dog world were selected. Hospitals, colleges and businesses often have people who facilitate meetings and groups as part of their job. Fortunately these dynamic ladies volunteered their services, but they would have been well worth hiring for what was accomplished.

A full Saturday was set aside and the executive and committee chairs (about 20 people all told) were invited to attend. Oh, they were somewhat reluctant - lots of muttering, but they came mostly perhaps because they were curious. Lunch was potluck and added fun to the day.

The club's constitution was the starting point, which focused on the purpose of the club and the group began with setting goals on how to fulfil each element. The goals were based on the SMAART principals - each goal had to be Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Agreed upon, Realistic, and Time limited. Each goal was broken down into a written action plan, assigned ownership to a specific individual or group of people, who agreed to follow up in a specified time limit.

By the end of the day they had 10 written goals, complete with a detailed action plan and a two-year deadline. These goals were taken back to the membership for their approval and acceptance. The club membership embraced the clearly defined goals with enthusiasm and set to work with such cheerful determination and dedication that within 10 months they had achieved nine of the 10 goals!

This club was inspired and motivated because they had clearly defined, achievable goals to work toward. They felt a part of the process because they owned the goals and were responsible for the success of the outcome. They felt wanted and needed and valued. They were all included.

The energy of the club was clearly evident and the sense of belonging was such an unexpected bonus. A large group of members would often meet informally for Sunday brunch at a local restaurant, to socialize and discuss their progress. They actually enjoyed being together again, again able to share their passion for the sport of dogs — with a clearly defined focus.

Encourage your club to try a facilitated planning day. Check with your local professional groups (hospitals, schools, businesses, etc.) to see if they have someone willing to facilitate and have your club set some clearly defined goals. Even if you have to pay a fee, it will be well worth the time and money spent to get back on track.

# Encouragement And Enthusiasm

After reading how in many countries people are worried about the future of the breed as dog shows and breeding do not interest younger people any more, I started to think why here in Finland we do not share those experiences, I might even say quite the contrary. I just read the comments of a foreign breeder visiting a Finnish show and remarking how nice the atmosphere was, how people helped each other and how they welcomed each other in all tents ringside. Of course there are exceptions, but this is also my own experience. Dog shows also interest younger people, maybe one has been a junior handler, then got a dog of her own and soon, with the help of an older more experienced breeder, is breeding herself, and with good results too.

Why is that? I have been discussing this with some breeders and owners. We all agree that one main thing is that showing under our show rules makes it more interesting even for the beginner, as we grade each dog (excellent, very good, good) and give them written critiques. Most people, after being encouraged by their dog's breeder, like to have at least a couple of judges' critics for their dogs. And if the dogs do well, why not go more often? We all like to win. Also our Sheltie club offers a special rosette to those who get at least three "Very Good" grades for their dogs, and to many this is the reasonable goal in shows, at least in the beginning.

I mentioned the importance of breeder's encouragement. Most puppy buyers, even though they want a pure bred dog, are not interested in dog shows or breeding. In Finland, unlike in many other countries, 99 % of pups are sold at 7 weeks and the show quality puppies may often end up as pure pets. Breeders who keep contact with the puppy buyers will soon find out which pups will be worth showing, but first they need to encourage the owners. If the pup is sold nearby, they can teach them grooming and handling themselves. If the pup is sold far away, they can advise the owners to visit local breeders in order to get some training, or attend the show courses arranged by different dog clubs around the country. Stud owners can also offer this same encouragement.

In Shelties we have four local branches, which may have smaller side branches. All of these arrange some activities to their members. Many breeders join their puppy owners to the Sheltie Club, so they get the Sheltie magazine four times a year, in which you get information of all the activities. Club web pages also offer information. One important thing that involves the sheltie owners are the mailing lists, on these names become familiar and when you meet in shows you put a face to the name and you get to know each other. Facebook is also used for this purpose; it brings people closer to each other. It is much nicer in shows when there are people you already know and in no time you have made a lot of friends. Sometimes there are buffets where everyone brings something to share and even outsiders are welcome to join. So a show become a social event, showing dogs is just one part of it and it is not the main thing how your dog does, if one of your friends' dog does well, you are happy for her/him as well.

Also it is important that in Finland we do not have professional handlers. So as long as anyone is able to gain the biggest wins with a nice well trained and well groomed dog, our future is bright.

## **OBEDIENCE WITH CINDY McDONALD**







Dunbowie Black Iris C.C.D

My name is Cindy McDonald and I live in Bathurst, New South Wales, Australia. We currently have two Shelties: a beautiful young man who has only just turned two - Simon "Thurrana Things To Do C.D.X" bred by Russell and Lorraine Thurling, his lines are mainly Almaroy, which are all English lines; and a gorgeous little girl who is just over one year old — Lara "Dunbowie Black Iris C.C.D" bred by Christina and John Williams whose lines go back through her sire to Grandgables, and through her dam to all English lines. I am a singer in a band named "Nuthin' 2 Serious" and unfortunately can only make it to very limited trials. This year I managed to get in early enough to book two weekends off just for trialling and the rest I have had to fit in with singing at night and trialling during the day. I am also currently the rescue co-ordinator for the NSW Shetland Sheepdog Club.

I have been training animals my entire life with my parents and fell in love in my early teens when I met my first Shetland Sheepdog "Tinkerbelle". From then on no other animal could capture my heart in the way that she had. At the age of 16 I owned my first Sheltie "Tamii".

At the beginning of 2009 I decided to start obedience training and was blessed with Simon who was 5 months old and doing very well in the show ring at the time we purchased him, unfortunately he went over height for showing here in Australia. I started training with the Denison Dog Training Club Bathurst and with one of Australia's top instructors, David Boland (Bolscot Kennels).

In August 2009, Simon entered his first trial and gained his C.C.D in three trials, all with scores in the high 90's/100, 4<sup>th</sup> place followed by 2<sup>nd</sup> and finished on 1<sup>st</sup> place. He then went on to the State Titles (which we only made it to on the Sunday) where he placed 5<sup>th</sup> in Novice on a score of 190/200 after I had only had 2 hours sleep. I was ecstatic. He then went on in early 2010 to place 1<sup>st</sup> in his next trial (189/200) and gained his C.D Title at the Bathurst Royal Obedience Trail on a score of 195/200 and came equal Winner of Winners with a U.D dog. In August we gained our C.D.X Title on a 3<sup>rd</sup> place followed by two 1<sup>st</sup> places. We have only just attended the State Titles again this year managing to make it to both days and on the Saturday he scored 192/200 and placed 1<sup>st</sup>. On Sunday we placed equal 5<sup>th</sup> on a score of 191/200, and we also gained our Dual Qualifier Medallion. Mind you, I lost him 2<sup>nd</sup> place due to one bad hand signal and not hearing the judge say halt on distance control.

I have truly been blessed to have obtained such a beautiful and consistent, eager to please best friend. We were also honoured this year to represent Dogs NSW in their Dog Expo Demonstration Team (which were all Shelties bar one).

My husband, Jon, after watching my bond with Simon, purchased his little girl Lara. Due to work commitments I ended up training Lara for her C.C.D title where she, like Simon scored all high 90's/100 gaining 1<sup>st</sup> place every day. My husband who has now only been in the ring four times managed to come away from the State Titles with a score of 199/200 in the Novice ring on the Sunday and needless to say 1<sup>st</sup> place!

Between the two dogs I have been in the ring only 18 times and have nine  $\mathbf{1}^{st}$  places, including a State Title win, two  $\mathbf{2}^{nd}$  and one  $\mathbf{3}^{rd}$  plus two  $\mathbf{5}^{th}$  State Title places.

My husband and I are in the middle of purchasing our first show Shelties and are hoping our success can carry on into the show ring. I have managed to book one weekend off per month next year to pursue our passion with our beautiful Shelties. We have just obtained our breeders licence under the name of "Sheltiemania" and hope to breed some time in the future, with the hope of passing on not only the true beauty of Shelties but also the unbeatable brains that go with that beauty.
